- Follows novel commands
- Follows two-step related commands
- Understands many new words
- Demonstrates action words on request
- Points to four action words in pictures
- Sorts objects into categories
- Understands early pronouns
- Understands early descriptive words/adjectives (including size)
- Recognizes family members' names
- Differentiates early quantity concepts including "one" vs. "all" and "more"
- Identifies common objects by function
- Understands new prepositions/location phrases (under, by)
- Comprehends simple questions
- Follows two-step unrelated commands
- Identifies parts of an object
- Matching – Related Cognitive Skill
